SUNDAY August 8, 2010		<p>Airport pick-up and transfer to homestay.</p> <p><u>Each family will be at <b>Juan Santamaría International Airport</b> with a sign with the name of the participant on it if arrival is before 10:00 p.m.</u></p> <p>We suggest that participants bring a small present for the family and pictures to show them.</p> <p>The participant will gain an idea of what participants in a Study Abroad Program will experience at arrival in Costa Rica.</p> <p>Note: Not knowing the Spanish language will not interfere in the communication process. Even though families will not use any English, they are used to receiving participants with very low levels of Spanish.</p>

Wood Factory and Juan Santamaria's Monument. Juan Santamaria was born in Alajuela (August 29, 1831 - April 11, 1856) and is officially recognized as the national hero of the Republic of Costa Rica. A national holiday in Costa Rica is held every April 11 to commemorate his death. The main International Airport in Costa Rica is named after him.

	1:00 P.M.	<b>Cultural site activity # 4:</b> Visit to INBIO Park (The National Biodiversity Institute). Private research and biodiversity management center, with 6 hectares of land, established in 1989 to support efforts to gather knowledge on the country's biological diversity and promote its sustainable use. The institute works under the premise that the best way to conserve biodiversity is to study it, value it, and utilize the opportunities it offers to improve the quality of life for human beings.  The "INBIO parque" is an amazing park where you will experience the sounds and sights of Costa Rican nature while walking along interpretative trails. You will see butterflies, orchids, heliconias and bromeliads; you will learn how poison dart frogs got their name; find out why it is better to avoid bullet ants, the largest in Central America; and witness a lagoon through an underwater glass window. There are also exhibition halls with multimedia and audiovisuals.
